HOW TO USE THIS PLAN

This plan is unique in that it is actually a working document providing a "To Do List" that, when implemented, will make Durant one of Oklahoma's best communities in which to live, work, and visit.

This plan began with a Destination Assessment, a look at Durant through the eyes of a first-time visitor: someone looking to relocate to the community, or look for a business opportunity, or simply come to visit Durant and the area.

The "suggestions" made during the Assessment process and follow-up stakeholder meetings and input were then developed into this two-year Action Plan.

This document is the primary plan you and the Destination Durant Team will work from throughout the process. The contents on the following pages form the To Do List items that can be checked off as you work down the list. It includes a brief description of the To Do item, who would take the lead, and the page where more information can be found.

For nearly every recommendation in the plan, you'll find a video in the Destination Development Association's (DDA) Resource Center, for which you have received login access. Some recommendations include viewing a particular video, while others don't. If you come to a recommendation where you can use additional guidance, and if a video recommendation is not already identified, contact the folks at the DDA and ask them which video would help you through that particular recommendation.

As part of this effort, you have recorded the actual Assessment Findings & Suggestions Workshop—the photographic look at Durant through fresh eyes. This can be posted to YouTube or any channel or website of your choice, and it can be broken into shorter "chapters" for easier viewing. This is a great way to engage the community, allowing them to see the community through fresh eyes.

The Action Plan was developed in Apple Keynote and saved as a PowerPoint presentation. The slides in that presentation are included in this plan. Then the presentation was sent to Imagine Durant. The presentation would be used when you want to share information with other local organizations, such as Kiwanis, Rotary, School boards and others.

To do so, you'd simply select the slides or portion of the plan you'd like to share, and then tailor your own presentation using some of these slides where appropriate, mixed in with ones you might add.

The PowerPoint presentation slides include "Shift Happens: The Eight Trends That Are Changing the Future of Communities Across America" as well as sections on branding (finding your Unique Selling Proposition), programming downtown activities, and additional information.

You also received the actual Adobe InDesign document this plan was developed in. If you have someone versed in InDesign, this plan can be changed, or recommendations moved around to fit changing timelines, funding sources, or organizations.

If you want to change the recommendation numbers, you can do that in the Apple Keynote or PowerPoint, then export the slides as JPGs, and then insert them into the InDesign document.

This is a plan that sits open on your desk, not tucked away on a shelf. It is a working plan, and a To Do List.

Perhaps most importantly, the Destination Development Association's Resource Center includes how-to videos and accompanying handouts for nearly every recommendation in this plan. As you get to a particular recommendation, the team charged with implementing it can view that particular video, which includes step-by-step instructions, great examples, and other information to assist you in easily implementing the recommendation.

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Important notes

Please note that beginning on page 190 is the section "Shift Happens." This section provides a wealth of information about major changes in the way we live, work, and play, and these shifts are changing the face of communities across the country. These changes are a driving force behind many of the recommendation in this plan. Please feel free to share this information. Using these guidelines and recommendations will help Durant become a leading community and a showcase among cities and towns everywhere.

This plan was developed in Apple Keynote (and also saved as a PowerPoint presentation) for several reasons:

- 1. It can easily be added to, or timelines changed, or assignments altered. No items should be eliminated without serious consideration.
- 2. It is a working plan or "To Do List," meant to be fluid. Times change and sometimes plans also require changes, which can easily be accommodated in this format.
- 3. It is simple and straight-forward and everyone plays a role in implementing the initiatives.
- 4. This is a two-year plan, and it should be updated in October of 2021, with updates and additions for 2022.

If Durant, and its partners, implement this plan, your tourism and sales tax revenues should at least DOUBLE in 2022, helping reduce the severity of the economic impacts of the 2020 pandemic. This is a two year recovery plan.

2021 is the "getting ready year" for the people of Durant so that this "Recovery Assessment & Plan" will help the community bounce back from one of the greatest economic disasters in U.S. history.

Location is ALWAYS second to the "primary draw" - that one thing that puts you on the map.

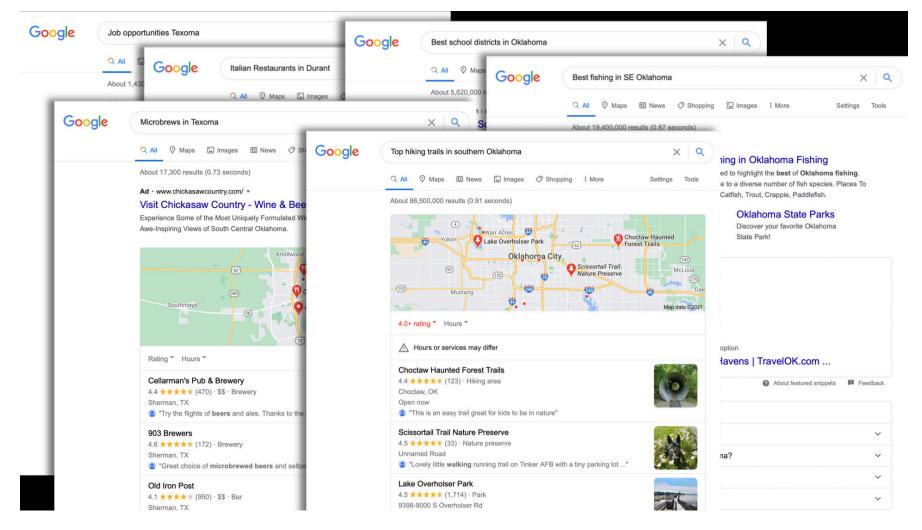
To win you must quit marketing geography first. It's always second to the experience.

When we use the Internet, we rarely type in the name of the city first. As you can see from the examples, above, we typically type in what we are looking for (the experience) and THEN the approximate location. This is why "branding" is so important. If your primary brand (or experience) is fishing, when people look for top fishing destinations in Southern Oklahoma or Northern Texas, you want Durant to show up. When you use a search engine and type in Durant and then can see you're at the top of the list, remember: you're likely one of the very few people ever doing that. This is why you MUST stand out from the crowd. There are nearly 600 cities and towns in Oklahoma. What set's Durant apart from all the rest? What makes you worth a special trip? Why should we choose to live in

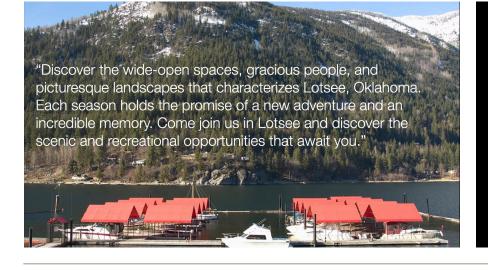

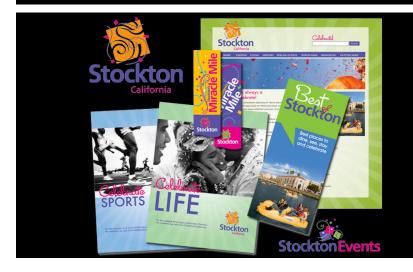

Entertainment may be your brand, but that's not your slogan or tagline. That always comes AFTER you decide on what you want to be known for. Then you work on your messaging: the look and feel of the brand and your tagline.

Taglines for a downtown with a focus on entertainment might be along the lines of "It's Showtime!" or "Always Entertaining," or "Downtown Durant: Time to Play!" Once you solidify your brand - what it is you want to be known for, then note what you have that will deliver on that promise (the product, experiences and amenities), and then work on what the "look and feel" of the brand is: Your logo, your tagline, and key marketing messages.

This is perhaps the most important of all the initiatives in this plan. You can implement the other downtown recommendations in this plan, but if you can't get your local residents and their visitors downtown on a consistent basis, businesses will continue to struggle downtown and vacant spaces will remain that way.

The goal of any downtown is to make it a central gathering place for local residents, their visitors and to visitors coming into the area. Additionally, it should be a focus, beyond the campus, for university students and faculty.

There are numerous videos in the DDA video library specific to plazas (in the Downtown Development section). Please watch some of these for ideas, examples, and case histories.

And of all the places we've ever worked, Durant already has a plaza in a great location, ready to go with some tweaks and enhancements. This one project will REALLY make Durant THE example for other cities everywhere to emulate.

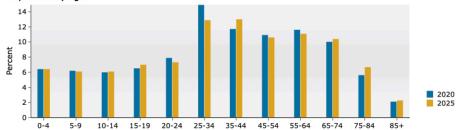

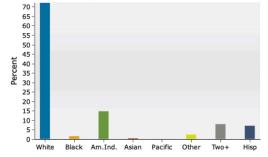
Population by Age
